Our last meeting was January 16th. As my luck would have it, I spent much of that day trying to keep my semi-truck running in the 20 below zero and the 40 below wind chill temperatures. So, I ran out of day and missed the meeting. However, thanks to Virgil, Mack, Bill Schafer, and Megan, I have all the information from the meeting. Thanks again to those people that watch out for me, so I can give this report.

The first discussion of the meeting was concerning the Basic Rider Course fees for 2021. Right now, the fees are \$195 for this course. Harley Davidson charges \$300 for the same course. Our goal is to keep these courses going, and if we don't raise fees, the courses will end. It was proposed to raise fees to \$250, but a motion was made to raise the Basic Rider Course to \$245 in 2021 and the Task Force approved it unanimously.

A copy of the 2021 Proposed Motorcycle Safety Budget was handed out. Bill sent us copies of the proposed budget for the last three years and I see little differences in the amounts except more money is proposed for advertising in 2021. I also noted that the number of training classes offered goes down every year. From 818 in 2018, to 500 in 2021.

In conclusion, we all need to take rider courses and encourage other people to take rider courses to keep this program going.

Our next meeting will be March 19th, at 5:00 pm at St. Paul College, room 1115. Guests are welcome to attend.

LEGISLATIVE REPORT

Due to Road Noise deadlines, I am writing this before the 2020 Minnesota legislature convenes.

Since 2020 is the second year of a two-year legislative cycle, the bills we supported and opposed from 2019 (excluding any bills passed and signed into law) are still active. I have shared these bills in previous articles and informed your chapter representatives at the January A.B.A.T.E. of Minnesota Board of Directors meeting in January.

Recently, an A.B.A.T.E. of Minnesota member informed me that the sales tax paid while transferring the title of an antique, classic, or vintage motorcycle are by far higher than those paid for an antique, classic, or vintage car. He felt this was wrong and so do I. I did some research and found out that changing this tax will need legislative action. I asked a prominent Minnesota Senator to look into it and by the time you read this we will have a fix in the works. This should be relatively easy, but through 40 years of closely monitoring the Minnesota legislature, I have learned that no legislation is easy to pass. This is as it should be. It should not be easy to pass laws in a representative republic (Note: America is a representative republic – not a democracy).



Woo Hoo... It's almost Spring!!! According to the calendar the first day of spring is March 19th. We all know that doesn't always hold true weather wise for us Minnesotans. We are all praying for the day we can take our Chariots out of hibernation and break our cabin fever.

Here are some safety reminders before going out for this season's first session of wind therapy.

Take the time to inspect your ride. Your Life Depends on It!!! Check your tires, not just the tread but the air pressure. The extreme cold causes a loss in air pressure. Start her up slow... don't just hit the throttle hard to hear that long-missed sound of the loud heartbeat coming from her exhaust!!! The lubricants

have all settled during her nap and she needs time to warm up and get the juices flowing throughout her body.

Take her out slow and easy...lightly braking to give the calipers a chance to loosen up and the pads to remove any glaze from build up from temperature changes during storage.

Top her off with some fresh high-octane fuel to mix with any remaining old fuel... she will love you for

Check your lights, and for any loose parts. We saw a few shifter foot pegs fall off last year.

Lastly once you hit the road, take your time. Refresh yourself with the fundamentals. Remember there will still be salt and loose gravel on the roads. Be extra careful of other drivers as they will not be used to us being on the road!!!
