

Hello A.B.A.T.E. members!

Since my last report the task force had a meeting and it was actually in person. It was good to finally meet our new leader, Jay Bock, face-to-face. We spent some time doing introductions again since Jay has never met any of us other than the one meeting online. After Jay introduced himself, he was honest with us and stated that he didn't fully understand what the function of the task force was. This was expected with the lack of overlap from Bill to Jay. He then asked for our guidance on what we do at the meetings which was really encouraging. Those of us that have been serving on the Task Force for a while, or since the dawn of time (fe), were quick to inform Jay on our duties.

During the meeting we discussed a variety of topics of which the first was trike rider training. I have had requests from a few A.B.A.T.E. members to find out why the Minnesota Motorcycle Safety Center (MMSC) does not offer this form of training anymore. The course ended when the only rider coach that taught it retired.

Discussions were had on whether or not to continue, but there was not enough potential student interest to justify keeping it going. If that changes, I'm sure the topic will be addressed.

Next, we received an update on this year's motorcycle crash fatality statistics. As I write this, there are currently 12 motorcycle crash fatalities so far. A disturbing trend, which I have talked about previously, is the elevated number of riders that didn't have a valid endorsement or permit. Five of the 12 fatalities either had suspended/revoked driver's licenses or zero legitimate rider education. Please keep your riding brothers and sisters safe by encouraging some form of rider training.

Now that I am on the topic of rider training, five hours prior to our meeting the task force rode an abbreviated Advanced Rider Course to sharpen our skills. As the turn radii progressed tighter and tighter throughout the course, I was pushing the limit of my skills. I certainly could have backed off to stay on the safe side, but then I wouldn't have the knowledge of where my limits lie. In doing so, I am not ashamed to say I tipped my bike over. Leaving a small scratch on the bottom side of my right engine guard is a small price to pay for the knowledge I gained that day.

Remember folks....Training and Education. Rider training courses are filling up at a record pace. The bottleneck right now is the MMSC has a shortage of rider coaches. If anyone is interested in pursuing that, please contact me and I will get you pointed in the right direction. Get out there, take a course, and have some fun!

I will have more to report next month. In the meantime, make good choices and keep your head on a swivel.

NCOM (NATIONAL COALITION OF MOTORCYCLISTS) REPORT JULY 2022

As I write this month I am also preparing to leave for the 2022 NCOM convention in Nashville. Tennessee. About 900 miles of estimated travel time, just over 13 hours. I remember back when I had a job the focus on these rides was often about the best way to make it in the least amount of time. I'd jump on the interstate, occasionally riding at what some alleged was excess of the posted limits. Typically trips under eleven or twelve hundred miles I expected I would make in one day each way. Ride hard attend three days of meetings and presentations and ride hard the other way to get back to the job. This trip will certainly be different, the only item I have to work around this time is the puppy I currently have "Hamlin." Hamlin is waiting travel arrangements to California to begin his training as a guide dog. His departure may determine when I leave for Nashville but worst-case scenario. I should be able to take at least a day and a half to get there. I also plan to take two to three days to travel home.

How much better can this get, four or five days traveling on my motorcycle taking in the sights, sounds and smells across our country to attend a convention. At the convention spend three days with like-minded Americans that care about our lifestyle. People that take their time to PARTICIPATE, to speak and to LISTEN, to teach and to LEARN to do their part to SHARE. Why do they do this?, so we can preserve a lifestyle that is loved by so many.

At the convention we of course have our Board of Directors meeting, we will also have presentations that should be of interest to the attendees. As I mentioned last month, we will have a presentation on insurance from a motorcyclist's point of view. Ed will be doing his presentation on the "Demise of Gasoline Powered Vehicles" the same presentation done at A.B.A.T.E. University this year. Information about how to "Protect your Privacy and Probable Cause" will be shared. We will have a breakout focused on

"Women in Motorcycling," another on "Christian Unity" in the motorcycle community and for those that wish a "Clean and Sober" round table.

Two others and I will be doing a presentation about communicating with legislator, letters, e-mail, phone and in person. This is an area where everyone has some different ideas and methods, and we all have room for improvement. We will be able to learn about the different ways and see what is the best fit for ourselves. In my opinion, the two most important things on this subject are do it, "communicate" and don't be offensive or burn bridges.

We will be fortunate to have the "Golden Hour" presented by Slider Gilmore again. I do not know how many times we have had Slider do this presentation, but until everyone has seen it, and can practice the skills Slider teaches, it is not enough. Learn these skills, your best friend's life may depend on it.

I would also like to mention an unusual experience I had this month. I received an e-mail from an A.B.A.T.E. member who expressed some opinions about A.B.A.T.E and shared some specific opinions he has about what he reads in Road Noise. Some of his remarks spoke highly about what has been written and some comments, specifically related to a recent writing of mine weren't quite as favorable. Although he and I did not necessarily agree on all the items he mentioned it was still good to get his e-mail. It was good to know that on occasion someone does read what we publish. It was also good to have a member engage, whether to agree or disagree, it is good to hear back from our members. This is how can we learn if we doing a good job, or do we need to make changes. It is important to hear opinions from others, please share your ideas.

This is also a good message to carry over for our "Write to Ride" program. If your elected representatives do not hear from you, how do they know if they are acting in your best interest, the best interest of those that elect them.





International Motorcycling Advocate Deb Butitta Killed in Arizona Crash

It is with a heavy heart and a great sense of loss that the Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF) shares the passing of Deborah Butitta. Deb had been committed to serving and protecting motorcyclists' rights at the state, federal and international levels during the last four decades. Deb was taken from us due to internal injuries suffered in a motorcycle crash after a truck turned left in front of her on June 3, 2022.

Deb was particularly active with A.B.A.T.E. of Arizona, holding many different offices through the years, and in 2001 was selected as the first designated lobbyist for the Arizona Confederation of Motorcycle Clubs (AZCMC). Deb was a member of many state motorcyclists' rights organizations, including the MMA of Arizona. She also served on the MRF Board of Directors for many years and was instrumental in the formation of MRF A&E (Awareness and Education), a 501(c)(3) charitable, non-profit organization created to assist the MRF in providing resources to promote motorcycle awareness and 'share the road' programs, along with all aspects of



motorcycle safety education including rider training. A highly successful businesswoman in her own right, Deb was extremely well connected, not only in the motorcycling community and industry, but legislatively and in some very influential social circles as well. These relationships were of incredible value to the bikers of Arizona and the entire country.

Deb's accolades and awards are many, including being inducted into the MRF Hall of Fame in 2020 and the Sturgis Hall of Fame and Museum in 2021. Deb is a past winner of the MRF President's Cup (2003), the MRF Founder's Award (2017), and the MRF Lifetime Achievement Award (2020). Among her many other duties, Deb served as the MRF's State Representative for Arizona for 14 years. For several years now, the MRF has given the 'Deborah Butitta Award' to it's highest performing State Representative in her honor.

A true leader, Deb had a profound influence on many of her fellow activists. Few people have dedicated so much of their life or contributed as much to motorcycling as Deb Butitta. Personally and professionally, her passing leaves a tremendous void in our "family."

My First Trip To Bikers Inside the Beltway

At the next gas stop he said his front tire had a wobble. As we where looking at it, the guy on the over loaded Harley stopped. This guy new how to travel, two sets of saddle bags and a pile on the rear seat that included a bugle.

Well turned out this guy by the name of Shultz was from the New Hampshire motorcycle rights organization. Shultz is one of the organizers of the Laconia Run. We knew we had to deal with the tire. It's Saturday eve at about 7:30 pm. Shultz told us to take the next exit and spend the night there. He said just south of there in Perrysburg, Ohio. There was a Harley shop that opened at 11. Yes, on a Sunday. We were at the Signature Harley shop waiting for it to open.


