Have you ever been out for a little ride, pulled over by law enforcement then invited to play the twenty questions game? You know the game, "Hi do you know why I stopped you? Hey how you doing today, where you heading?" Or "where are you coming from? I haven't seen you (or your patch) around before, do you ride with a group from around here?" Or a very popular one, "how many drinks have you had today?" Questions that are just gathering intel because the officer has a preconceived opinion that because you ride a motorcycle you must be a criminal. Or questions intended to get you to commit to some action that the officer looking to make quota may be able to twist into some sort of a traffic charge and write a citation. They know many of us would rather just pay a fine than take the time to appear in court to get a charge dismissed.

I am not always in favor of the laws passed in California but I think this one is an exception. California Assembly AB 2773 Bill Signed by Governor Sep 29, 2022. Some segments of the bill I like "This bill would, beginning on January 1, 2024, require each state and local agency to include in its annual report the reason given to the person stopped at the time of the stop." and "This bill would, beginning on January 1, 2024, require a peace officer making a traffic or pedestrian stop, before engaging in questioning related to a criminal investigation or traffic violation, to state the reason for the stop, unless the officer reasonably believes that withholding the reason for the stop is necessary to protect life or property from imminent threat". If you want all the details just google California AB2773.

As many of you know I have been a little vocal about profiling or other harassment stops of motorcyclists in the past. Just because of a particular officers' prejudices should we be stopped, or detained, could legislation like this help reduce those events? On the rare occasion that I may have mistakenly violated a traffic regulation, speeding, lane filtering or other and an officer feels the need to stop me this would require he tell me the reason before he or she starts questioning me. How would it work if the officer would simply identify himself, identify the reason he has chosen to stop me take whatever official action that is necessary and let me go on my way. I don't need to sit on the side of the road talking with him or her about where I have been, where I am going, how many cups of coffee I have had today, the color of the new drapes or anything else he or she is feeling the need to talk about. Let's take care of the business at hand, deal with the alleged violation and let me go on my way. Then the officer can go someplace, get a cup of coffee and fill out a report on his eventful day.

In closing my report, I will share that for some time I have had a concern about my contributions to NCOM. I don't feel I have been accomplishing things I should and I don't know how to fix it. With that in mind I have made the decision to submit my resignation to NCOM and see if that allows some others to step in and make more meaningful changes. This is a decision I have been struggling with for a while and was difficult to make. My relationship with NCOM has allowed me to have some wonderful experiences, see some great places, meet some fantastic people, and a few others too.

Remember,

Be on time, Be prepared, Stay to the end.

It increases your odds of success.

I do want to take some time, once again, to share about the need for rider coaches in the state. I received a text message from an unfamiliar number less than a week ago. It turned out to be a new member of Central Chapter who was interested in finding out what is required to become a rider coach for the Minnesota Motorcycle Safety Center (MMSC). I sent him the application and all the information I have. It got me thinking, he must have read this in one of my task force reports, so perhaps I should bring up the topic again. There is currently a shortage of rider coaches in this state. In fact, there were rider training courses canceled throughout the state last year due to this shortage.

Please don't hesitate to reach out to me with questions you have. I will have more to share next month. Make your own choices and keep your head on a swivel.

Letter to the Editor:

Last month I wrote about step one of the great motorcycle rights freedom fighter Sputnik Strain's Five Steps to Freedom. Step one was focused on getting involved in the voting process. If most of the people you hang around with are politically active, step one might seem pretty basic. But in 2022 39% of Minnesotans who were eligible to vote failed to do so. Think about that for a minute: 1.6 million Minnesotans did not exercise a right that half of the world's population wishes they had. The current governor won by less than 200,000 votes and several house and senate seats were decided by less than a couple hundred votes. If Minnesota motorcyclists' voting participation was closer to 100%, our riding rights would be much easier to keep. Now let's look at step two.

Step Two: Get Acquainted with Your Legislators.

Minnesotans are governed by a "citizen legislature." Our house and Senate members are regular people who come from all walks of life. While their life experiences may make them particularly knowledgeable in a few areas, they can't be expected to have all the answers on every topic. This is where you come in. Constituent input is a huge part of lawmaking. We live in a time of easy and free communication. Call or email your senator or representative about issues important to you, especially motorcycling related. Very few legislators ride on a regular basis. So, it is important they here from us. After all, who knows more about motorcycling than motorcyclists! After a while, you will be considered their "go to" person for biker issues. Sputnik offered the following tips on communicating with legislators:

"Never lie to an official to make your case seem more solid. They have heard them all and you will only brand yourself as a phony. Don't offer a compromise you are not certain your association will honor. Let the official realize you will always be above board on any issue. Treat each official with whom you encounter honesty and integrity as if dealing with a friend and you might just find you are. Always address only one issue per letter or visit unless requested to do otherwise."

For the Young Riders that participate in the First Aid class the certification fees will be free, the fees will be covered by others. In addition to that we will have a special door prize drawing that will only be open to Young Rider members and there will be no fee to enter that drawing.

SF 1598 Digital Fair Repair Act. Authored by Senator Kupec (04 DFL) and 4 others and companion bill HF 1137 Authored by Representative Fischer (44A DFL) and 19 others. Mack is watching SF 1598 very close and has some questions and concerns. If you are thinking about writing on this, I suggest you have a discussion with Mack first.

SF 2132 Motorcycle ground light. Authored by Senator Coleman (48 R) no companion bill at this time.

SF2573 Motorcycle sales tax. Authored by Senator Hoffman (34 DFL) and I other and companion HF2376 Authored by Representative Petersburg (19B R) and 3 others

HF2365 Motorcycle sales tax. Authored by Representative Harder (17B R) and 1 other and companion SF2395 Authored by Senator Gruenhagen (17 R)

We have reached out to a former House member that is now serving in the Senate that has supported us on other issues and asked them to Author and support an anti-motorcyclist profiling bill but at this time we have not heard back

If you write and get a reply on any of these issues or others, please submit reply for your W2R patch/ rocker We will file the information, track support or opposition to our issues and get your patch/rocker to you.

When you write remember state what you want, why you want it, how it benefits you, or others, or all. State facts, tell the truth, be courteous, be brief, and ask for a reply.






