



I am humbled & honored to have been asked & accepted to become your next liason to the National Coalition o Motorcyclists {NCOM}, hopefully I bring a new perspective to the good things we do together to ensure motorcyclists and the bikes we ride are always given consideration in the mode of transportation mix on our planets roads and trails.

BILL INTRODUCED IN CONGRESS TO PREVENT I.C.E. BANS

U.S. Representitive John Joyce(R-PA) along with more than sixty Republicans cosponsors has introduced House Resolution 1435 "To amend the Clean Air Act to PREVENT the elimanation of the sale of Internal Combustion Engines-I.C.E."

Titled the "Preserving Choice in Vehicle Purchases Act," H.R. 1435 was introduced March 8th and is designed to protect American's right to choose the technology that powers their motor vehicles, the measure was introduced in response to the California Air Resource Board's (CARB) plans to ban the sale of new internal combustion engines (ICE) vehicles by 2035.

The Preserving Choice in Vehicles Purchases Act would restrict the U.S. Environmental Protection Agenct (E.P.A.) from issuing any waiver for new regulations that would ban the Sale or Use of new motor vehicles with internal combustion engines (I.C.E.s)

The bill follows action in August 2022 by CARB which approved new requirements on automakers that would effectively ban the sale of new ICE cars & light trucks by 2035 in favor of so-called zero-emission vehicles, like plug in hybrid, full battery-electric, and hydrogenfuel cell vehicles.

Lawmakers supporting H.R. 1435 say it is important that the E.P.A. does not permit CARB's ZEV (Zero Emission Vehicle) mandate

to take effect, as it could lead to 17 other states that have followed all or part of California's previous clean-car rules adopting similar proposals.

H.R. 1435 has been referred for consideration to the U.S. House Energy and Commerce Committee.

We have our work cut out for US, but together WE can and will do great things.

Welcome to what may not make any sense to those with kids, grandkids or even great grandkids. While some states require that a passenger's feet touch the foot pegs in order to legally ride on the back of a motorcycle, indicating adequate physical stature, New York and Georgia are attempting to take it a step farther by restricting passengers by a minimum age.

A2690 in New York would "Prohibit children under the age of 12 from riding on a motorcycle", while SB71 in Georgia states "Manner of riding Motorcycle; motorcycle passengers shall be no younger than 16 years of age." Both of these bills have been referred to their respective committees, where staunch opposition is expected from rider groups.

I ask you, "are you ready to let legislators kill riding motorcycles?" This could be the beginning to the end if we cannot share the pure joy that riding motorcycles bring you and me with our future generations at an age where these impressions mean the most.

As your liaison to the National Coalition of Motorcyclists {NCOM}, I ask for help in combatting this and any other nonsense designed to either eliminate or stop legal motorcycle riding by calling 1-800-531-2424, or logging into www.ONABIKE.com and Register for FREE to RIDE protected with our A.I.M. {Aid to Injured Motorcyclists} emergency card to carry when you sign up for this FREE service!

In closing, If you're into short notice vacations or if you're living right and are retired from that four letter thing (work) and want to ride into our beautiful southwestern and western states, hit me up as soon as you read this for more details, because I'm rolling out towards the NCOM convention on Friday, June 9th.

Nothing New to Report



Call to Action!

The last three months I talked to you about the great motorcycle freedom fighter Sputnik's plan of five steps to freedom. The first two steps of Sputnik's path to motorcycling freedom were somewhat simple. Vote and communicate with your legislators. In step three he showed us how putting up yard signs and handing out campaign literature for a candidate you believe in will establish a bond that will benefit both of you going forward. Now it's time for step four.

Step Four: Working the Caucus

Step three was about using your muscles to help a candidate. Step four is about using your mind. In Minnesota candidates are endorsed using the caucus system. These are meetings run by the political parties (Republican, Democrat, and others) and start at a very local level. Here you will meet your neighbors and members of your community who have a similar interest in the political process. This is where the candidate endorsing process begins. Using your social skills, you will hopefully convince others that they should favor your chosen candidate (The one who favors motorcycling freedom!). It is also where the group elects delegates who will represent your area at the county and state level. By becoming a delegate you will have a major influence on who will be running for office and what their goals should be (the party platform). Since precinct caucuses usually have low attendance, you have a good chance to become a delegate and carry the motorcycling freedom torch up the ladder just by showing up. As Sputnik said, "Only by gaining the support of others can we guarantee our right to ride for years to come."

The next Minnesota precinct caucuses will be in early 2024. Try to learn as much as you can about the process between now and then and you will truly make a difference. The MN Secretary of State website has much more information on this. Next month: Sputnik's Fifth Step to Freedom.

Spring/Summer has arrived and I'm positive a lot of you are out taking day trips or getting lost on some back road in rural Minnesota. Maybe while you're out there you should take along some 2023 State Rally Raffle tickets to

sell. I'm sitting here looking at over 1000 tickets waiting for a good home! Hit me up and I will get them to you ASAP. Maybe even willing to take one of those day trips to hand deliver, weather permitting of course!

Last month we were able to make \$2,500 worth of donations to organizations like Patriot Guard, a senior center, community action organization and a pet rescue. Keep sending in those requests and giving us ideas for new ones.



There was a recent alert from MRF concerning H.R. 1435 the "Preserving Choice in Vehicle Purchases Act." This and other alerts sent out by MRF are important. They should get your attention. They should get you to take action. Because these alerts are going out to people across the nation, they are a standard message and they are accurate at time of publication. I suggest when you make the decision to take action vou take the time to do a little investigation on your own. It is pretty easy. You can do a google search using the bill number and title. Example "H.R. 1435, the Preserving Choice in Vehicle Purchases Act" You will get to a page where you can see the bill text, authors, committees, status, and other important information. You may see that your elected representative is the author of the bill or you may see the bill has already passed into law, things that are important to know.

When you click in to send messages on these alerts you will see the message that is ready to be sent. It may or may not be appropriate for your situation. Using the information, you have just researched you can determine if the message ready to be sent is appropriate. If not, you have the

ability to make changes to the message, to make it appropriate and to make it personal. It does not take very long to be informed about these topics and to make the message yours. Be sure the message that is being sent is the message you want to go to your legislator.

We still have some stuff pending in Minnesota but most anything that will affect motorcycling will be delayed or will be rolled into an omnibus bill. I do not know of any of our issues that will be addressed as standalone bills this session.

I know of some cities and counties that have issued or are considering motorcycle safety proclamations. Duluth, Osseo, Frazee, and Carver County have stepped up.

I, and a fair number of other A.B.A.T.E. members live in Chanhassen. In the past I have requested they issue a safety proclamation but I have been informed it is not going to happen. I don't think Chanhassen has issued a motorcycle safety proclamation since my wife was a member of the council. I guess they don't have time for such nonsense, after all the only benefit of a safety proclamation would be the possibility of saving serious injuries or deaths of motorcyclists.

You might have noticed there was no task force report in the last Road Noise. I submitted it in time, but I never caught the fact that I didn't receive a receipt email from the editor. I'm not quite sure what happened, but you have my apologies.

The last task force meeting was held virtually on March 16th. The original plan, agreed upon at the meeting prior, was to meet in person with a virtual option. Unfortunately, we were told 3 days prior that it would be all virtual. At the beginning of the meeting, Jay wanted to remind everyone that these task force meetings are open to the public and he encouraged us to spread the word. The first topic of discussion was the A.B.A.T.E. Young Rider's Scholarship I gave a detailed report on the progress of this endeavor to the group (If you would like an update on this, please read my Education Report).

Next, we received an update on the progress of the task force's version of the May Motorcycle Awareness Month proclamation. Jay made it sound as though someone from the Department of Public Safety (DPS) had reached out to someone within the Office of the Governor and received positive feedback on the idea. The task force is still in agreement that we should send our own proclamation out regardless of the Governor's decision. The more the merrier so to speak.

We also discussed a strategic plan for the task force. In essence, where is this task force headed and why? All the members were asked to send in their thoughts before the meeting for discussion at the meeting. Few of the many topics submitted where briefly brought up such as; coming up with a mission statement, involvement in electronic sign messaging concepts on our freeways, and promoting enforcement of existing motorcycle laws (impounding motorcycles operated by unendorsed and unpermitted riders). In my opinion, a brief overview of the suggestions and a thank you to all, with no in depth discussion at that time. Perhaps there will be more in future meetings.

A few more updates discussed were; Dial-A-Ride materials have been printed, media advertisement concepts are in the selection process, and a legislative report submitted by Mack Backlund was reviewed.

The next task force meeting is scheduled a week after the deadline for this article, so I will have fresh information to share in my next report.

Roads are clearing up and it is time to ride. Please be vigilant and remember the cages haven't seen you on 2 wheels for months. Make your own choices and keep your head on a swivel.

Advanced ticket sales will be final by then.


