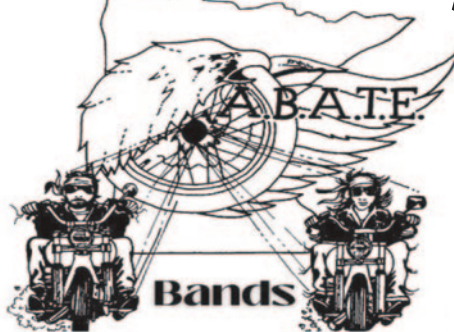

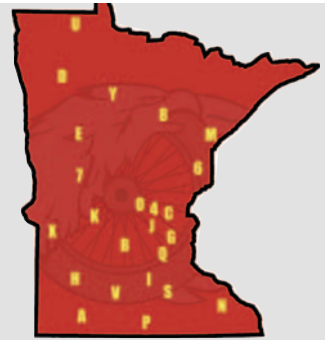

I want to thank the writer of the letter to the editor in the July issue of Road Noise. The comments made make me think we have not done a good job of sharing information with our members. What is A.B.A.T.E. doing about Rider Training and other educational activities involving Young Rider and A.B.A.T.E. members? Over the years Rider Training and Road Guard classes have been sponsored by several chapters and on occasion at A.B.A.T.E. University. Some of these classes have required participants pay the full fee and some have been paid in part or fully by a Chapter or A.B.A.T.E.

Now let's take a look at where we are presently for rider training and education. In 2023 A.B.A.T.E. board of directors approved a budget that included paying for a group rider training class to be held in each of our four A.B.A.T.E. districts. 2023 is the first time we have ever budgeted for group rider training classes and at the time of this writing the first of these classes has taken place. Unfortunately, that class had less participants than we would have liked, but it was a start. Rider training classes in the remaining districts are in various stages of planning.

In addition to this A.B.A.T.E. members made a commitment of thousands of dollars to be spent on training Young Riders (riders under 21) something we have never done before. I know at this time we have registered and paid for more than 20 students to participate in the BRC (beginning rider's class).

We have funds committed to pay for more and requests are still coming in. When we provide funding for these Young Riders, we do not get information back on success or failure of students. We only get information if they attended or not. We will be following up with scholarship students following their scheduled class date to gain more information. In addition, the scholarship dollars we have committed do not have to be used exclusively for BRC we can help with any of the rider training classes provided by the Minnesota Motorcycle Safety Center. If you know a Young Rider that could benefit, please share our message with them.

I would add that Education and Training is not just about training students how to ride. We have been helping in other ways. We have had A.B.A.T.E. volunteers sharing the message of Share the Road as long as I can remember. Unfortunately Share the Road was severely compromised by Covid. Many of those that previously hosted these classes were not willing or ordered by the powers in the state to not participate during the pandemic scare, so we lost some opportunities. Now that the threat of Covid is no longer restricting us, efforts are being made to upgrade the Share the Road class and get more

members taking part. If you would like to hear more or get involved contact Jon at

We have also increased our efforts to present safety and first aid classes for our members. At A.B.A.T.E. University 2023 we presented a First Aid/CPR class. We also presented the Stop the Bleed class. This is the first time Stop the Bleed had ever been presented at A.B.A.T.E. U. There was a small fee for those that attended the First Aid/CPR if they wanted to get a certification card. For the Young Riders (under 21) in attendance that were certified, A.B.A.T.E. of Minnesota paid the certification fee for them. These classes were all very well attended and we taught some people some skills that I hope they will not need to use, but if needed those they help will be happy they were taught.

We provided some Young Riders training on the legislative process. A number of young people joined us as we visited with our elected officials at Bikerday at the Capitol. They experienced an introduction to the legislative process.

This is some of what we are doing with Education and Training, is it enough? I think not, but I think it is more than we have done in the past and I think we are headed in the right direction. In the July letter to the editor, it was stated "I think we need to get back to what A.B.A.T.E. is all about." My question to all members, who is the WE he speaks of? Each one of us could ask ourselves what have WE done to promote Awareness, Training and Education.

Have you taught a Share the Road, taken a rider training class, recruited a Young Rider to take part in training, helped organize a group riding class? These are just a few of the ways We can promote Training and Education.

At the State Rally this year we would like you to consider putting in three hours to help sell ice. Our schedule this year is 9:00 am to 9:00 pm, with 3-hour shifts. We will have a sign-up sheet at the Security building at the Rally.

Thus far we have had 52 pickups, let's increase that number, so we can lower deaths and accidents.

28 motorcyclists or their passengers had died in crashes this year as of last Tuesday, according to

the state Department of Public Safety. That's a number just slightly behind the pace set in 2022, when the state recorded 82 deaths – the most since 1985.

Impairment, distracted driving, and speeding are among the factors contributing to the high death toll, said Jay Bock, safety coordinator for the Minnesota Motorcycle Safety Center. Lack of skill, particularly when navigating curves or attempting to avoid road hazards, is another big factor, he said.

DIAL-A-RIDE CAN HELP WITH PART OF THAT, PLEASE IF YOU ARE IMPAIRED CALL 1-888-342-5743, help keep that number of fatalities down. That one fatality might be you, your family member, or a best friend.

Even better yet, get with Kari our products person who has blank thank you style cards with the A.B.A.T.E. logo and make a personalized ask about H.R. 906 and

send it to them by USPS.

Meeting of the Minds is coming up at the end of September in Harrisburg, PA. This gives you a little bit of time to make arrangements to make the trip to PA. This is a great event and we will be setting our priority list for next year's legislative session along with some great presentations.

Don't forget the State Rally is just around the corner and the MRF puts on a chili contest on Saturday at 11:30 am. There are three categories: Best Chili, Hottest Chili, and Most Unique Chili. They are voted on by the people that come and sample them. We will provide the sample cups for judging so all the contestants need to bring is the chili. We will not ask for the recipe. So, if it's your family secret recipe it stays that way. It is always a good way to meet the MRF assistant reps along with myself and get signed on as a member of the MRF. You do not need to be a member of the MRF to participate, but it would be nice if you are.

The Young Riders Scholarship program has taken off and spread its wings. To date, we have signed up and paid for 24 students to take the Basic Rider Course using A.B.A.T.E. of Minnesota gambling funds. Of the 24, four students' classes have already happened. The first student didn't get their permit in time for the class and still has an opportunity to reschedule. The second student showed up for the class and left because he didn't have his permit. Students three and four both attended their classes. Student three is under 18 and when I reached out to him to follow up about the class, he responded by saying that he passed the course and subsequently went and passed his motorcycle permit test. He thanked us for the opportunity to learn how to properly operate a motorcycle and how important he believes that is. I would ask you all to think about something when you are buying or selling A.B.A.T.E. raffle tickets. These gambling funds are paying for kids under the age of 21 to take rider training courses. I have found that people that are on the fence about purchasing a ticket are more likely to buy one when informed of this fact.

I would also like to share an update on district rider training. The first event was held in the Northeast District at Pine College on June 24th. Chad Marchand put a lot of effort into getting riders lined up. We had eight people committed out of a possible 11 seats. A few days before the class, four dropped out. Then the day of, almost all

dropped out. Chad set aside a family commitment at the last minute to take the course and Jay Hickok rode down from the north to participate. Thank you both for your commitment to rider training. Have you ever heard the expression, "you can lead a horse to water, but you can't make them drink?" It's surprising how many people have their drive belts snap the same day as a rider training course during inclement weather.

The last I had heard from Edgar, there is zero interest in the northwest district. It is disappointing that our membership is not interested in taking free rider training opportunities.

I have also been working closely with Shelly in the Southwest District and we have an intermediate course lined up for Sunday, July 30th 10:00 am - 3:00 pm at North Mankato. There are currently 10 riders committed out of a possible 12. If you are interested, or even want to be put on a backup list please contact Shelly Deutsch (state office/southwest district director).

As far as the Southwest District is concerned, I have been hounding the Rochester College contact with no progress to show for it. My apologies to Donna Larish and the members of the Southwest District, perhaps we will have to try a different location.

We have started some new and positive initiatives for A.B.A.T.E. of Minnesota. Whether it be the scholarship program or district rider training, I believe we are moving in the right direction. With anything new, there will always be hurdles along the way. I humbly ask for your patience and your help. 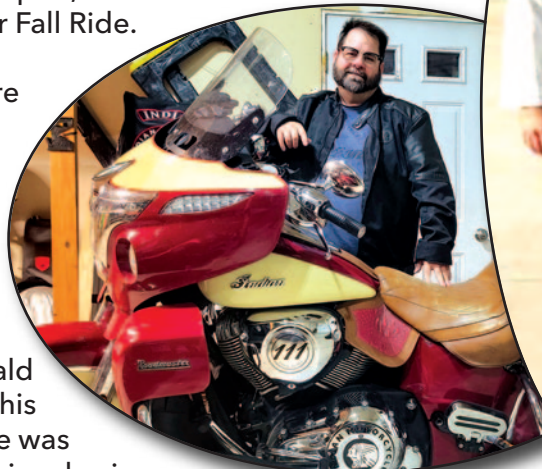

Considering the next task force meeting is the Thursday following the July B.O.D., this report will be relatively short. Most of the current information was published in the July issue of the Road Noise, with the exception of motorcycle crash fatality statistics.

Currently the grim statistics are slightly behind last year's high numbers. There are currently 28 motorcycle crash fatalities. 29% of those fatalities where a rider that was not endorsed or permitted to operate a motorcycle, and 54% were in between the ages of 20 and 39.

The questions I ask all of you are; Where do you fit in to all of this to make a difference? Do you know a young, uneducated rider? What can you

do, personally, to reduce motorcyclist fatalities in this state? Please keep in mind, the higher the crash statistics climb, the greater the push will be to take away our freedoms to choose how we prefer to ride our motorcycles.

That's all I have for now. Please watch out for one another, make your own choices, and keep your head on a swivel.

The application requirements of the A.B.A.T.E. scholarship training program include:

- Be at least 15 years of age (and under 21 years of age)

- Meet the Minnesota Motorcycle Safety Center requirements for attending a course.
