

The Motorcycle Rights world is facing some serious challenges that could have serious consequences for our lifestyle.

Many Motorcycle Rights Organizations (MRO's) are facing declining membership. The so-called self driving cars are killing and injuring bikers without any concern from the federal regulators. Our access to the fuels that we want to run and are recommended by the manufactures are under attack. In some cases using the wrong fuel could void the warranty of the motorcycle. The internal combustion engine is clearly under attack. How are 500,000 bikers going to plug in at Sturgis? How are all of the RV's and motorcycles going to plug in at the A.B.A.T.E. of MN Rally? Bikers continue to get profiled by law enforcement. I don't believe any citizens of the U.S. should be singled out by law enforcement for what they ride or wear.

People involved in motorcycle rights and the motorcycle industry are growing very

concerned about these challenges and others. Motorcycle rights organizations, shop owners, aftermarket people, and motorcycle clubs face all of these challenges together. We had a quick meeting squeezed in at the A.B.A.T.E. State Rally. We discussed the possibility of trying to get some activities lined up that young riders may like to help with and participate in at our October B.O.D. If we get things worked out, we will send a message to all contacts on our Zoho e-mail letting people know.

We also discussed giving students that participated in rider training utilizing an A.B.A.T.E. Young Riders scholarship a Young Riders complimentary membership.

A person has suggested we try to put together some type of book or list with names of businesses or activities that would offer Young Rider discounts. Numbers, Numbers, Numbers..... so many things to talk about, so here it is.

The Rally Memberships are all done and sent to be printed. Here is the breakdown: we had 109 memberships purchased at the gate, 60 of these were new, and 49 were renewals. I have a breakdown of each Chapter:

Flatlanders2 new
Tri-Co1 new & 1 renewal
Straight River1 renewal
Borderland1 renewal
Rolling Prairie1 renewal
Way West4 new & 6 renewal
North Star1 renewal

The September report was pretty disappointing we lost 249 members....

ST. PAUL, Minn. - The number of deadly motorcycle crashes is down slightly in Minnesota and state officials want that trend to continue. Office of Traffic Safety Director Mike Hanson said there have been 55 fatalities compared to 69 at this time last year. "We still have two months left of our riding season and we [have to] be aware," Hanson said. "Those motorcycles are out there. We need to pay attention."

All that have Dial-A-Ride trailers, we are coming to the end of riding season only 28 days left, thank you.

The Rally was awesome, we had a lot of help with ice this year, might have had something to do with the shirts. Sales were 169 - five-pound bags and 302 - twenty-pound bags of ice, the hot weather helped also.

MOTORCYCLE SAFETY TASK FORCE

This article picks up where the last one left off, an overview of our July meeting. Kent, an advisor from the MNDOT highway engineering department, will be joining us from now on, when available. In July he spoke of getting the task force involved with experimental anti-slip paint surfaces for the Minnesota roadways. Currently, glass beads are added to the paint for nighttime illumination purposes. This creates a slippery surface during wet conditions. As trained motorcyclists, we know to avoid painted surfaces during wet road conditions. But that can't always be avoided.

In July I found myself riding in a torrential rain storm with poor visibility. While entering a roundabout on Hwy 7, I tried my best to avoid the crosswalk paint but failed. My rear wheel busted loose and kicked out. Fortunately, I kept the bike upright and arrived home safely, but soaked. MNDOT will be experimenting with adding gravel in with the glass beads for increased traction. Perhaps the task force will have an opportunity to test how motorcycles

handle on this new paint formula.

A discussion was had regarding the motorcycle safety month proclamation (from the task force) that never came to fruition last May. The task force came up with a suitable proclamation, but somewhere along the way, it was never published. This is something we can focus on as a group to make happen for next May.

Lastly, I would like to touch on the current motorcyclist fatality statistics. As I write this, there have been 54 fatalities this year. On this same day last year, there were at 65. Last year was one of the worst in many years with a final total of 82. We are behind last's totals, hopefully we can stave off this increasingly fatal trend. Please consider riding within your skill set and reducing your risk factors in ways that are acceptable to you as a rider.

The task force meeting is in a couple of weeks from when this article was written. I will have new information to share at the October board meeting.

For now, make your OWN choices and keep your head on a swivel.

As Gary mentioned in his report last month some items that were introduced and are pending include SF 2132 Motorcycle ground light. SF 2573/HF 2376 Motorcycle sales tax. HF2365/SF 2395 Motorcycle sales tax. SF 1598/HF 1337 Digital Fair Repair Act. HF2630/SF 2178 Electric Vehicle Surcharge - This states that motorcycles will get charged \$30.

Last month in her report Jane asked "What do you think our A.B.A.T.E. of Minnesota legislative priorities should be?" What priorities do you think we should focus on, are you willing to help, willing to take part, willing do what needs to be done to reach those goals?

If you recall in 2022, we faced a bill that would require motorcyclists to have un/under insured insurance coverage on their motorcycles. Do you think that is forgotten about or is it possible it will crop up again during the 2024 legislative session? As I have reported previously when I testified in committee on that insurance bill the statement Minnesota does not have an adult motorcycle helmet law was made multiple times.

As I watch the direction our state is currently going, I am truly concerned, it may not be long before we are fighting for freedom of adult choice again. I see multiple issues at risk, mandatory un/under insured insurance, electric vehicle mandates, restrictions on or elimination of motorcycles to make way for the introduction of self-driving cars not capable of recognizing motorcycles.

Do any of these possibilities concern you? Will you want to get involved? Here are a few suggestions on how you can help. W2R (Write 2 Ride), send letters, make phone calls, talk with your legislators. Bikerday at the Capitol, (tentatively scheduled for Wednesday, March 13th) plan to be there, register in advance, show up for your appointment and share your opinion. PCR (Political Contribution Refund) help candidates and or political parties who support your opinion, elect people who will work to support our position on issues.

I am sure you will hear more about how to help as we move toward the next state legislative session. If you have questions, want to volunteer, or need help please reach out. Keep in mind if everyone helps it works, we can win.

The Price of Apathy

As patriotic Americans, we often talk about the price of freedom. We talk about the sacri-

fices required to protect our rights and about those who came before us, people of integrity who oftentimes gave everything they had in pursuit of an ideal; of a country and a way of life where our children and grandchildren can grow up proud to be Americans, unapologetically embracing a system of government that many other people in the world would love to have. We talk about our service men and women who made the ultimate sacrifice, and we are thankful to live in a country that allows us to live our lives as we please, to enjoy the freedom provided by our Constitution, to be able to participate in what laws are passed and which ones aren't, and to teach our values to future generations.

In the motorcyclists' rights world, we also talk about guarding against undue government intrusion into our lives and warn against the influence of mainstream media propaganda aimed at tearing down some of our most basic and cherished beliefs. When you get right down to it, that's why the motorcyclists' rights movement exists. It's where we started and why we still fight for our rights at every turn. As past MRF President Karen Bolin once said, "We're in the freedom business."

Now consider the price of apathy, of seeing what's around us, knowing that some of what's happening is wrong, and doing nothing. Doing nothing, of course, is taking the easy way out. In many cases it's the old 'not in my backyard' philosophy of 'If it doesn't affect me directly, why should I worry about it?'

The challenges facing motorcycling today are among the most serious ever, and those challenges are - like it or not - in everyone's backyard. The MRF and our partners in state motorcyclists' rights organizations are fighting for the right to repair our own bikes, without being forced to have services that we could easily manage ourselves be performed by dealerships charging exorbitant rates. We're fighting to protect consumer choice through a strong aftermarket, ensuring that we have access to the vast number of options on parts the aftermarket gives us, parts that are many times better and cheaper than what we'd get from the OEMs. We're fighting to keep unsafe soft-

ware being used in autonomous, self-driving cars and trucks from being tested on our nation's roadways and killing bikers in the process. We're fighting to keep our ability to buy fuel that won't destroy our engines, as will be the case if gasoline with 15% ethanol becomes our only choice. We're fighting to preserve internal combustion engines, rather than being forced to buy electric vehicles at a time when neither the battery technology nor a sufficient charging infrastructure to support such vehicles is in place. We're fighting to prevent unfair profiling of motorcycle riders. And the list goes on.

So, what price apathy? A riding public that chooses to ignore the threats to motorcycling while sitting idly by, expecting others to do the hard work of protecting our rights and our lifestyle, is arguably the biggest threat we face. Ask yourself: Should we, through our actions, control our own destiny? Forge our own futures? Or should we sit back, foolishly believing that the government knows best how we should run our lives and hoping for the best. There are roughly 8 million registered motorcyclists in America. If even a small percentage of that group were to join with the MRF and our partners in our mission to preserve motorcycling, imagine what we could do. Then imagine what will happen if the vast majority of those 8 million riders choose to do nothing.

Since 1987, there's only been one organization exclusively devoted to protecting the rights and lifestyle of street riding motorcyclists in the halls of Congress, and that's the Motorcycle Riders Foundation. To those of you who are already members of ABATE of Minnesota and the MRF, thank you. You've already proven that you're committed to helping protect and preserve motorcycling. That said, we still need your help.

All of us have friends who are not members. If you're not an MRF member, please help us by joining. If you're already a member, please renew your membership each year, and of equal importance, please sign up one of your friends as a new MRF member.

The price of apathy is the loss of freedom, an open invitation to tyranny, and - without a strong MRF - could well be the end of motorcycling as we know it.







A.B.A.T.E. of Minnesota Young Riders Scholarship Program

A.B.A.T.E. of MN is a non-profit motorcycle rights organization that stands for **American Bikers** for **Awareness, Training,** and **Education**. Our organization promotes motorcycle crash prevention through motorcyclist safety awareness, training and education.

A.B.A.T.E. is currently funding a scholarship program to pay for the cost of attending rider training courses. These funds are limited and will be approved based on application date and required criteria until all available scholarships have been awarded.

Why should you consider taking a rider training course? We believe that continued motorcycle training

is key to building the proper foundation of good riding habits and better rider skills to create the best overall motorcycling experience.

Taking annual training courses is key to refreshing your skills, maintaining your riding ability and improving your overall skillset.

What better investment can you make than yourself? What better pay off can you have than attending a free rider training event while possibly earning your motorcycle permit or endorsement?

The application requirements of the A.B.A.T.E. scholarship training program include:

- Be at least 15 years of age (and under 21 years of age)
- Have a valid Minnesota Driver's License prior to attending a course
- Meet the Minnesota
