

We have a Young Rider who attended Bikerday 2023 that receive a letter from her State Senator. The letter specifically addresses a recent accomplishment of the Young Rider and congratulated her on her achievement. When I asked the Young Rider how the Senator knew her name, she said she did not know of any other way they could have gotten her name other than by meeting them at Bikerday. Congratulations to our Young Rider on your recent accomplishment, on the communication from your Senator and thanks for being a part of A.B.A.T.E. Young Riders.

I recently visited a motorcycle repair and sales shop to talk about A.B.A.T.E., Young Riders and Rider training. The shop I was visiting is recognized as an American V-Twin shop. They told me that because of their area of specialty, young people are not their primary customer base. I mentioned that as true as that may be, I would expect that many of their best customers may have children, grandchildren and even great grandchildren that have an interest in motorcycles. They agreed and we continued to talk about Young Riders. I told them we are looking at events and activities that may interest Young Riders or their family members. I suggested that if they have an open house, or other events at their facility, to let us know. It may be something we would like to post on our Young Riders Facebook page. Then we went on to talk about our rider training Scholarship offerings. They agreed this is a great program and they complimented us for what we are doing. They expressed a concern with the reports of accidents, deaths and injuries and anything we can do to improve this situation is very worthwhile. They also shared thoughts about current trends in the Minnesota legislature and how it may come to have a negative effect on motorcycling.

The discussion was very interesting and I appreciated them taking the time to share their

thoughts. Before parting, I mentioned they could become a business Young Riders supporter, it would benefit young riders and would also put their name in front of our members and other readers every month for 12 months. They have not committed to that yet but I will follow-up.

I want to add a comment about Young Riders supporters, present and future. We recognize the time period, from beginning to end, that the supporter donation covers when we publish the list each month. Example: Proud Supporter July 2023-December 2023. If an additional donation is made to support the program before the first donation period ends, we will publish the new end date but the beginning supporter date will remain as before; July 2023. We are starting to make some head way with the district rider training events. The Southwest District hosted an intermediate rider course on July 30th in North Mankato. 11 of the 12 possible seats were filled, all of which were A.B.A.T.E. members. Even more encouraging news is that this was the first rider training course ever taken by seven of the eleven A.B.A.T.E. members in the class! If I have my information correct, two of the members that had been coasting on their motorcycle permits for years went and took the BRC and got their endorsements just so they could take the intermediate course with the district. In my estimation, the Southwest District rider training event was a great success.

I have been working with Edgar Burke in the Northwest District to get a rider training event going up there. He has found some interest in the North Star Chapter and has contracted an intermediate rider course for Saturday August 19th, 1:00 pm - 6:00 pm at the Bemidji range. By the time you read this article, I should have some feedback as to how the course turned out.

I missed the July B.O.D., but I had heard second hand that there were some rumblings of having the Southeast District rider training event in Albert Lea, as I have been unsuccessful with communicating with the Rochester location. I hope we can get it done yet this riding season.

On the Young Riders Scholarship front, we are plugging right along. So far this riding season, A.B.A.T.E. of MN has paid for 35 youngsters to take the Basic Rider Course. It's neat to hear some of the feedback I receive from these kids. In one instance, the student extended his utmost gratitude to A.B.A.T.E. of MN for paying for his course and explained that he was going to take the \$245. that he saved to pay for the course and go purchase safety gear with it. I work with the college system to get attendance reports on these students. There is a bit of a lag between when they take it and when I receive the report. Currently, I have received reports on nine students of which seven attended their classes. That puts us at about a 77% attendance rate. I expect this number will climb.

All in all, I believe our organization is headed in a positive direction. There are some new and exciting things happening, if you would like to get on board and help, we sure could use it. I'm leaving for Sturgis tomorrow morning, so I need to get packing. See you in the funny papers!

I did a Minnesota legislature new law search for 2023-2024. Here is what I found.

2023 new law search results: Minnesota Human Rights Act to prohibit hair discrimination. State road construction gets \$315 million federal funding boost. New law codifies provisions of Indian Child Welfare Act in statute. Juneteenth is now a state holiday. The Attorney General's office gets a \$4.3 million bump to help assist county attorneys. Inflation to be included on both sides of the budget, economic forecast. Transition from federal public health emergency, unwinding medical assistance eligibility. New law says Minnesotans can cast a ballot if not behind bars. New law aims to curb catalytic converter thefts. Federal grants for energy projects get a match from state funds. Annual revisor's law makes needed technical changes. Reauthorization of the environmental trust fund will be put to Minnesota voters in 2024. Driver's licenses will be accessible regardless of immigration status. New law establishes Minnesota as a safe haven for reproductive health care. Trio wrongly imprisoned, handful of others, to get relief via claims law. Easier voter registration, automatic absentee ballots, foreign-influenced spending among changes in new law. Statutory review of physical education standards delayed. Conversion therapy banned for minors and vulnerable adults. Purple signs to mark Prince Rogers Nelson Highway. Universal no-cost school meals instituted for K-12 students. Modifications to substance use disorder treatment. Transition to renewable energy boosted by climate and energy provisions. Cuts and credits, hikes and aids fill tax finance and policy law. New deferred prosecution assessment process for current and former military members. New law permits electronic signatures on last wills. Annual revisor's law makes needed technical changes. One-time funds will help the overworked Office of Administrative Hearings. Increases in funding, fees and taxes are all part of transportation law. Health law lifts abortion restrictions, provides \$1.78 billion in new overall spending. Emergency food shelf funds provided by new law. \$14 billion human services finance law includes numerous rate increases. Omnibus lands bill becomes law. Disaster Assistance Contingency Account replenished with \$40 million. Crime of labor trafficking resulting in death encoded in statute. New law establishes Minnesota as a 'Trans Refuge' state. The Motorcycle Industry Council (MIC.ORG) reports that two major bills have been passed in Minnesota and Maine that will create challenges for the powersports industry. One bill is set to ban products containing PFAS chemicals, and both of these bills specify strict reporting requirements.

In Minnesota, HF 2310 bans products for juveniles (KIDS/GRANDKIDS) that contain PFAS beginning January 1, 2025. It also specifies PFAS registration requirements beginning January 1, 2026 and bans all products containing PFAS on New Year's Day in 2032.

Minnesota's new PFAS legislation will prevent significant challenges for powersports companies doing business in our state, "In powersports, PFAS chemicals can be found in or used to produce products such as riding gear, vehicle component resistant to heat, fuel, and chemicals, as well as semiconductors and chrome plating" explains the MIC report, also noting that Perfluoroalkyl and Polyfluoroalkyl substances are a class of synthetic chemicals used for decades in a wide range of consumer products.

The last task force meeting was held on July 20th at Saint Paul College. We had a nice change of pace as Jay Bock put together some invites from the State Patrol, MNDOT Highway Engineers Office, and Dial-A-Ride.

Our first guest was Lt. Robert Zak of the Minnesota State Troopers. Among his many qualifications are overseeing accident reconstruction and experience as a former motorcycle cop (when the program was still running in this state). Lt. Bob showed us a short video of what it was like to take "motor cop" training in this state back in 2007 or so. He congratulated those of us that take continuous rider training and explained how it will prevent diminishing rider skillset.

If you have been reading these articles or paying attention to the rider crash fatality statistics you know that unpermitted and unendorsed riders have become a major issue in the last couple of years. When asked, Lt. Bob said the State Patrol's policy when an unlicensed motor vehicle operator is pulled over, is that the operator is done and the vehicle is towed away. The State Patrol does NOT want the liability of what may happen if the operator is let free to go with a warning. His statement garnered a few cheers. He also encouraged us, as members of the task force, to reach out to the Minnesota Chief's and the Minnesota Sheriff's Associations to get this concept out. Ultimately, it is up to each law enforcement entity, and perhaps each officer, on how they enforce the law.

The two-year term has come to an end for members of the Minnesota Motorcycle Safety Advisory Task Force. in the past, A.B.A.T.E.'s recruitment efforts have led to a pro-freedom majority on this task force. They are now accepting applications for the next term. Would anyone in your chapter, or that you know, be willing to apply? The task force term is two years long and meets on the 3rd Thursday of odd numbered months (12 meetings during the two year term). If you are interested in details, please don't hesitate to reach out.

It is reported that motorcyclist fatalities are trending down, hopefully the trend continues. As I write this, there have been 35 fatalities this year, as opposed to 52 on the same day last year. Great news considering the past couple of years.

Due to time constraints and respect for publishing space, I will fill you in next month on the MNDOT HWY engineer's report, a proclamation update, and a few other things.






