

Last month we sent you information on methods to communicate with legislators.

Here is information on how to earn a Write 2 Ride patch and or rocker. Next month we will send some information concerning important motorcycling issues to write about. What more can we do to help you get started? You need to be involved to protect the motorcycling life style.

Here is my fear, my vision, of the near future. When we need to go someplace, we will get in the back seat of a box with wheels but no windows. We will speak into a microphone telling the box where we want to go. Then we will sit back and tell others sitting in the box with us how much we used to enjoy going for a ride on our motorcycle.

WRITE TO RIDE

The goal of the Write to Ride program is to encourage awareness and communication between A.B.A.T.E. members and government legislators at the state and federal levels.

MEMBER RESPONSIBILITIES

Establish initial communication with the legislator. (State or Federal) The communication does not need to be motorcycle specific, but can be related to any issue of legislative concern.

Forward a copy of the reply correspondence to the Write to Ride Manager along with the A.B.A.T.E. member's name and chapter name. Although written communication is preferable, verbal interaction may, at the discretion of the program coordinator, be used to earn a Write to Ride patch or rocker if reasonable verification of the exchange is provided. Copies of e-mail correspondence will also be accepted. If reply correspondence is addressed to multiple recipients, only one member will be presented with the patch and/or rocker. Please indicate which A.B.A.T.E. member should receive the patch, and/or rocker. In the absence of response from the legislator, a member may submit a copy of the initial correspondence,

indicating the communication format used (postal service, e-mail, etc.), the date the contact was initiated and the number of attempts made. Requests should be sent to Write2Ride@abatemn.org or mailed to Frank Ernst.

Eligible first-time participants will receive the Write to Ride patch and a corresponding year rocker. A.B.A.T.E. and Young Rider members will be awarded a rocker for each subsequent year of participation. Patches and rockers will be awarded only to members providing reasonable proof, each calendar year, of communication with a legislator.

PROGRAM MANAGER WILL

If requested, help members identify their legislators and provide appropriate phone numbers, addresses and e- mail addresses. Organize records for patch and rocker recipients: record legislator contacted, Subject of correspondence, date of correspondence.

Record patch and/or yearly rocker awarded, date that the award is presented to the member.

Send patch and or rocker to member. Typically delivered to chapter representative at quarterly Board of Directors meeting or mailed to Chapter President. (If other methods are preferred, please indicate when submitting request)

There is not much to report on this month, considering the next task force meeting is eight days after this report was submitted. As I wrote in my last report, I did receive a verbal and a written commitment that the DPS will resume printing the Share the Road informational periodicals and that they should be ready for dispersal in late January. I have been checking online and will continue to keep up on the situation to ensure that the commitment is fulfilled.

For those of you that receive motorcycle tab renewal notifications in the mail, you may have noticed a rider safety/rider training advertisement inserted in the envelope. This is something the DPS has slacked on for a few years and members of the task force have been advocating to get back on track. I am happy to see it was finally printed and inserted this year. When I received mine, I scanned the QR code which brought me directly to the Motorcycle Safety Center website. Unfortunately, there was no link available for me to sign up for a rider training course. Considering a rider training advertisement went out to hundreds of thousands of motorcyclists in this state with no link to sign up, I quickly took action to rectify the situation by contacting the DPS Office of Communication. Apparently, there was a timer on the website that removes the link for a few months over the winter season. I have been told this is something that the task force advised to be done years ago. Well, things change rapidly, now more than ever and I don't see the need for this currently. The timer has been switched off and the link is available. I would not have known classes where available, but A.B.A.T.E. had already signed up a few kids for 2024 rider training classes through our Young Riders Scholarship Program.

I will have more to report at the January Board meeting and in the next Road Noise. Please stay safe, make your OWN choices, and keep your head on a swivel.

Which of the following topics is your motorcycle lifestyle hot topic? Autonomous Vehicles, Distracted Driving, Lane Filtering/Splitting, Profiling, or is it something else? Whatever it is, embrace it and let's get busy changing it!

Are you aware that four states (California, Utah, Montana, and Arizona) have lane filtering laws which allow varying flexibility for motorcyclists to filter between lanes? Last year, seven other states introduced lane filtering related legislation. Lane filtering is used to reduce our risk exposure in heavy stop and go traffic conditions.

DIAL-A-RIDE

As I sit here looking at the snow outside, looking forward to the 2024 riding season. 2023 riding season was pretty darn good, Total motorcyclists killed on our highways was 69, year 2022 a total of 77 killed, and 2021 a total of 80 were killed. This tells me our efforts are working, because as the number of registered motorcycles continues to rise, accidents are on the decline. Sadly though, seven passengers were among those killed this past 2023 riding season.

Continuing to see those crashes involving only the motorcycle is almost half. Negotiating curves is the biggest reason for those accidents. Whether the rider was either incapacitated or not skilled enough to take the curves no one knows for sure other than the motorcyclist.

Collisions with animals there was six with deer, and one with a wild turkey. Rider's ages ranged from under 20 to 70 years old. The deadliest age ranges this year is 20 to 29. Crashes in rural areas were 37 compared to 28 in urban areas. Alcohol/drug impairment was a known cause in nine deaths in 2023, down from three from last year.

We need everyone's help this year even one death, is to many. Please, if you have a Dial-A-Ride trailer or use your trailer to help transport your fellow rider in trouble, we need your name, organization you are with, trailer license number, along with your information. Dial-A-Ride will have forms available to fill out for each chapter, at A.B.A.T.E. U.

A heads-up regarding A.B.A.T.E. U this year. Motorcycle Dial-A-Ride will be offering a Saturday afternoon breakout session, for those chapters interested in participating in the program, materials will also be available for 2024 riding season to those that sign on.



It should be noted that the little funds that A.B.A.T.E. had in the early days went to hiring an engineering firm to determine whether a raked front end or an extended front end was safe. This resulted in two lengthy documented reports, complete with engineering drawings that established proof that they were safe. This allowed bikers to fight "unsafe vehicle" tickets in court with scientific facts - not just opinions.

EASYRIDERS, on behalf of A.B.A.T.E., also picked up the tab on a test case concerning an extended front end being unsafe. From 1971 to 1974, most of A.B.A.T.E.'s efforts went into fighting such laws. Had it not been for the efforts of A.B.A.T.E. and EASYRIDERS in the early 1970's, choppers would have been outlawed.

(It should be noted that an article on this matter can be found in the April 1972 issue of EASYRIDERS magazine on page 31. An interesting read. I think so anyway.)

As of January 9th, we have already registered and paid for eight applicants to take the Basic Rider Course (BRC) during the 2024 rider training season! For those that are interested (like me), two kids registered in Duluth, one in Wilmar, one in Eden Prairie, one in Alexandria, one in North Mankato, one in Rochester and one in Marshall. A nice spread across the state so far, considering this report was written in early January.

I am guessing that if you look at the Young Riders report in this month's issue, Frank will be writing about the first business that signed up to be a supporter of the A.B.A.T.E. of MN Young Riders Program. A couple of weeks after Bergdale Harley-Davidson (in Albert Lea) signed up to be a Young Riders Supporter and began promoting what we are trying to accomplish, I received an email from a scholarship applicant that also copied an employee of Bergdale Harley-Davidson on that same email. That applicant is currently registered and funded to take a Basic Rider Course (BRC) through the scholarship program this year. This is the beginning of something unique and potentially successful for everyone involved.

I have been informed that Lake Chapter has already begun the process of hosting a back-to-back contracted rider training weekend in June. My home Chapter (Tri-County) has just voted in favor of partially funding a contracted Intermediate Rider Course in June also. It is really encouraging to see Chapters already getting on the rider training band wagon this early in the year! If anyone, or a Chapter, is interested in taking or contracting a rider training course, please do not hesitate to reach out to me for help. The process can be a little intimidating at first and I am quite familiar with it.

There are plans in place to make an announcement at the January B.O.D. regarding District Rider Training (DRT) for 2024. As I wrote about before, Darryl Holman (North Star) has taken the reigns for this program and has some fresh ideas for the coming riding season, so stay tuned.

I also have an update the "Share the Road" periodicals. Please reference the Motorcycle Safety Task Force report in this month's issue of the Road Noise.

We are working on a number of things and making some progress. There are plans to develop a type of Passport Run for Young Riders. We will invite our young riders to step away from their computer screens and get out touring some of Minnesota's 75 State Parks. We will ask them to send us a photo with themselves and the state park landmark to verify their participation, and we will find a way to reward participants. Perhaps entering their name in a drawing, one entry for each different park they visit. It will be a great opportunity for them to participate and experience firsthand how state government works. We will be trying to get some pictures of Young Riders at Bikerday. We may use some of them on our tri-folds or in other applications related to the Young Riders program. Be sure to tell our guests, look pretty, smile and plan to sign a release that we will provide so we can use the photos.

We have Young Riders/Education meetings scheduled for February 12th and March 11th. These are Zoom meetings so you can attend without leaving the comforts of home. We are hearing a lot of favorable feedback about involving Young Riders but we need to have more people step up. We need you to share ideas and offer suggestions. How can we make the program valuable to the younger people? What can we do to get them and keep them involved? All suggestions are appreciated and although all suggestions may not be implemented, they may lead us down the path to bigger and better things.






