The first paragraph of this report are comments copied from my first Young Riders report published in November 2022.

Years ago, A.B.A.T.E. had a program called YOUNG RIDERS. The program was planned to provide activities and opportunities to attract younger people to A.B.A.T.E. The people trying to get this started had some good ideas and plans but just couldn't get it going. Some of the problems at that time may have been finding funding, communication methods, activities of interest, marketing avenues and possibly others. In that report I mentioned those starting Young Riders had some great ideas. It just didn't take off. I shared some of the possible reasons why. I forgot to mention what was probably the most important reason the program did not flourish. Dave "Breezy" Kavanaugh moved to Colorado. Breezy was the one spearheading Young Rider and had some great ideas. I have had some recent email exchanges with Breezy, the first time since he moved away. He shared how thankful he was for the support he was given by some. But also mentioned some others were not on board with making the program succeed and he was disappointed with that.

Here are some other comments and suggestions Breezy shared. He stated that he came up with the name Young Riders from the TV series of the Pony Express riders, Young Riders. He also added that Rick Arguello designed the logo. Then he shared this idea, without knowing what ages are targeted or responding I'll toss something out there as food for thought based on me chopping my first bicycle when it was brand new. Dad wasn't happy with my cutting down the rear fender and the custom paint job out of a spray can!

15 years ago, I was in New York and early on a Sunday morning in Manhattan about 30 beautiful customized bicycles ridden by mature Puerto Rican men in leather vests with patches came riding down 5th Avenue in a pack. It was a cool site. My idea good, bad or in between would be to have a bicycle show with categories like stock, modified stock and custom or whatever. Could attract a lower age group and give kids too young to get into MCs a way to get involved. I'm sure there's a lot going on and a lot of ideas, so no hard feelings here if it's never spoken of again.

Breezy had and still has some good ideas. Share your thoughts. Is this something young people in your community would enjoy, can you help get it started, perhaps a chapter or district event, competition? Please share your ideas.

Last week the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) announced a policy change related to gasoline with 15% ethanol (E15). In 2025 this new policy will allow gas stations in eight midwestern states to sell E15 fuel year-round. Current policy prohibits E15 sales between June 1st and September 15th because of concerns that it adds to smog on hot days. In 2022 and 2023 the EPA announced emergency waivers that allowed for summertime E15 sales, citing market disruptions, including the war in Ukraine. This move by the EPA will make those temporary changes permanent in the selected eight states.

The rule, which takes effect in April 2025, will apply in Illinois, Iowa, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, Ohio, South Dakota and Wisconsin. This decision comes after governors and farm groups in these eight states requested that the federal government change this policy. This modification is a prime opportunity to remind everyone to be mindful of the fuel that you use. Verify that the fuel you are using in your bike is compatible with manufacturers' guidelines. Stay vigilant as these changes take effect over the next year!
