MOTORCYCLE SAFETY TASK FORCE

Next Meeting(s): May 16th, 5:00-7:00 pm, St Paul College with a virtual option

There has been no change regarding the status of the task force. Currently, there have been no voting members appointed. However, I can report on what happened during a gathering of task force applicants that took place on March 21st.

We had a guest speaker join us who, in my opinion, was well-spoken and provided a different perspective on motorcycle crash scenes. Assistant Fire Chief EMS of St Paul Fire Department Steve Sampson shared about his experiences responding to motorcycle crashes. In his opinion, there are three major factors in serious injury motorcycle crashes. Speed, distraction, and gear. Excessive speed of the motorcyclist and/or the other vehicle involved, distraction of the motorcyclist and/or the other vehicle involved, and the gear the motorcyclist chooses to wear.

Without any judgment on my part, I pose a question to you. How fast do you like to ride/drive? How distracted are you by a phone/device in your vehicle or on a motorcycle? What type of gear do you choose to ride with?

Sampson also spoke about drawing awareness to our vulnerabilities as motorcyclists and the importance of training regarding his concern for motorcycle operators being qualified to ride (we refer to as permitted or endorsed). He also talked about the importance of getting EMS to the scene ASAP and what types of first aid supplies, us as riders, can carry in our saddle bags that could be of use in emergency situations.

An advisor to the would be task force asked Sampson what his opinion is on autonomous vehicle technology. Asst. Fire Chief Sampson's response was to the effect of "Have you seen the drivers out on the roads these days?". Sampson stated that he is more confident in autonomous vehicle technology than human drivers. But also conceded that the technology needs more development and testing standards. Personally, I share the same opinion. This technology isn't going away, we just need to ensure that testing standards include motorcycle recognition.

At the gathering we were told that the motorcycle safety proclamation our group came up with has been forwarded to the Governor's office, but they have not heard back as to whether or not he will proclaim May as Motorcycle Safety Awareness Month.

The afternoon of our next gathering on May 16th, the task force applicants have been invited to participate in a rider training course at St Paul College. We will be the guinea pigs for what may potentially be a new rider training course in the future. This concept course is referred to as Crash Avoidance Training (CAT), It would be a mixture of intermediate and advanced course curriculum. There are currently only a few ranges in the state that are big enough to host advanced and expert courses. This CAT course, if offered in the future, would be qualified to be taught on the BRC/IRC sized ranges, which would make the curriculum portable to any Minnesota Motorcycle Safety Program range in this state. It would allow participants in the outer areas of Minnesota to learn some of the advanced curriculum without the need for excessive traveling distances.

As the pavement and the rubber of your tires warm up, make your own choices and keep your head on a swivel.

We had a Young Riders table at the Donnie Smith Show in St Paul. Harmony and Stephanie, with help from their Young Rider family members, tended the table.



A.B.A.T.E. U is here and past. Did you attend? At the time I am writing this I do not know how many, if any, of our invited congressional delegation or their representatives stopped in. But did you take time to meet any that were there? Did you tell them thank you for taking time out to meet us?

Elections are coming this year. Will you be planning to support those that have an interest in your issues?

At the April Board meeting we distributed Write 2 Ride patches and rockers to Lake, Freedom First, Up North, Heart of the Lakes, River Valley, Sand Dunes and Rolling Prairie chapters.

Now I want to step back a little in history to the 1990s, a time when each year we could count on a new bill being introduced to eliminate your freedom of choice regarding using or not using a motorcycle helmet. We would get word of a hearing being conducted and A.B.A.T.E. members would flock to the Capitol to attend the hearing. The hearing room would be full. They would have the audio playing in adjoining hearing rooms so the overflow crowd could hear. Do you think the committee members noticed that we were there? Do you think they believed that we cared?

Ground lighting, a topic our members brought up a while back at an A.B.A.T.E. Board

meeting, they wanted us to take some action. In 2023 we included this in our Bikerday talking points. When we were at the Capitol in 2023, we spoke with legislators about the issue. Senator Coleman (Carver County) stepped up and said she would author a bill. She introduced SF 2132, and the process was started. We did not get a hearing in the 2023 so it was held over to this year. At Bikerday 2024 we were made aware that a hearing on SF 2132, OUR bill, was scheduled.

So here are some questions I have. Did you talk to your legislator about this issue? Did you write letters? What was your legislators reply? Did they support us, oppose us, or not have an opinion? The reason I am asking these questions is because our members did not forward letters sent or replies received from legislators concerning this issue to Write 2 Ride!

Earlier I talked about packed hearing rooms from the 1990s. So now let's fast forward to March 18th, 2024. SF 2132, OUR bill, was scheduled for a hearing in the Senate Transportation Committee. Jane was there to testify. Do you know how many A.B.A.T.E. members were in the audience? The Senators on the committee know, they know if we care or not.

The April Board meeting will be complete by the time you read this so you will know the current status of OUR bill. I hope you are pleased.
