Revised letter to the editor, another attempt!

Having read the letter from a former Legislative Director published, July, 2024 Road Noise page 6. I am not sure who specifically the writer is upset with, it just says leadership. Although not currently in a leadership role I am choosing to reply because there were comments added that referenced our Write to Ride program, that does concern me. I submitted a letter for the August and September 2024 Road Noise issue, but it was not published. It may not have met with the strict standards for letters to the editor, there may not have been space or there may have been other reasons unknown to me that it was not published.*

knows I was present when it was brought up by Senator Coleman. As I recall she simply asked about thoughts on the issue. I and others in attendance replied A.B.A.T.E. did not have an official position, I added that I personally supported it. There were Lake, Tri-County and other chapter members present at that meeting so I expect the word spread quickly that it was brought up. The July letter said the bill was introduced and there was a hearing on April 8th. Just so everyone understands, the bill S.F. 5174 was introduced and first reading on March 21st, I think I heard it was introduced March 28th or 29th. At that time there was not a house companion bill. About a week later, on April 4th, I heard there was to be a hearing four days later. When I heard of the hearing, I sent a message to inform others. The message was sent to some Tri-County, Lake, and some

The message sent stated Lane Splitting would get a hearing "support it or oppose it, I suggest you encourage all you can to attend". I am only aware of one A.B.A.T.E. member being in the audience during the hearing. (Looking back, I realize I should have sent the message to all contacts on ZOHO, my bad).

The July letter to the editor asked why members were

not informed. I would like you to consider Senator Coleman asked about the issue at Bikerday. Many people, from multiple chapters were present when it was mentioned. Senator Coleman introduced the bill, many Tri-County, Lake and some other chapter members live in Senator Colemans district. Messages were sent to members of the largest chapters in Senator Colemans district. Did the message reach them? Did they or didn't they have the opportunity to know about the hearing? Did members that knew go to the hearing? Did members that knew write, or call their Senator? Did these members tell others? It is very unusual that a legislative change that affects us moves this rapidly and I agree, others and I could have been watching a little closer. Please keep in mind when I say others I am talking about each of us. We do not have a full-time staff person dedicated to watching and following everything that happens, we all need to help. This may not have turned out the way some wished, but all

I would like to share a quote taken from the Legislative director report submitted and published in November 2017 Road Noise page 9. "This is a new issue in our state, if the vote didn't turn out the way you wanted it to please don't take your ball and go home" then he adds "The bottom line is this is only one issue, bikers face many challenges and we can't take them on by ourselves we need strength in numbers to protect our community."

Motorcyclist fatalities are currently at 51 compared to 57 last year at this time.

2024 Riding Season Statistics as of September 1st: 51 Killed in 48 crashes compared to 57 killed in 55 crashes in 2023. The record set for most fatalities was in 1980 with 121 motorcyclists killed in 112 crashes, 42% decrease, showing that the education that is now being utilized is making an impact. A.B.A.T.E. began in Minnesota in 1984. Helmet use was 21 were wearing helmets and 25 not wearing. Motorcycle crashes: Rural area 24 Urban area 24, 21 crashes were single motorcyclist involvement, 27 crashes were involved with another vehicle. Accidents involving Trikes and Spyders were two, involving an animal five, four of them deer, three passengers, 30 endorsements, 18 no endorsement. 18 crashes involved failure to navigate curves, six were drug and

alcohol, and 42 crashes were unknown cause. Unable to Ride, call Motorcycle Dial-A-Ride.

If you haven't cast your ballot yet the time is near, November 5th.

This month I am going to share some opinions and suggestions! Just my thoughts. Take them or leave them, it's up to you. Here are some things I would like you to think about before you go to the poles to cast your ballot.

How do you decide who to vote for? Do you vote for the candidate from the political party your parents voted for? The candidate your union tells you is the best choice? The candidate that is of a race, sex, religion or geographic area you favor? Or perhaps you just vote for whoever is running against the incumbent because you think everyone in office now sucks! Does any of that sound familiar? Do you know where the candidates you get to choose from stand on issues of importance to you?

Please keep in mind the people we elect will make many decisions on what you are required to do, allowed to do, or prohibited from doing. It is important to add, if you are one of the people that doesn't vote because you think your vote doesn't matter, or because you think elections are rigged, or because you hate them all, please reconsider.

Minnesota Candidate Survey Results

For the 2024 November 8th Elections

Survey results received by September 10th, 2024

Note: If your candidate is not listed, they did not respond to the questionnaire by September 10th. For survey results received after the deadline, check the A.B.A.T.E. of Minnesota website for updates.

Thank you to the A.B.A.T.E. of Minnesota Legislative Team and Mack Backlund for collecting and compiling the survey data.

Candidate Questions

- 1. A.B.A.T.E. of Minnesota believes adults should have the choice to wear or not wear a helmet while riding a motorcycle, which is the current Minnesota law. Do you support adult motorcyclists who are properly licensed and endorsed to choose their riding gear?
- 2. A.B.A.T.E. of Minnesota believes motorcycles are a viable part of the transportation mix. Increasingly, motorcyclists feel singled out by law enforcement because of their appearance, apparel, or because they are simply riding a motorcycle. Will you support legislation that would require additional training for law enforcement to limit the practice of profiling motorcyclists?
- 3. A.B.A.T.E. of Minnesota believes in fair taxation. Motorcyclists who transfer a title for a motorcycle which is ten years old or older and valued at less than \$3,000, or have a motorcycle that is 20 years old or older who ask for a "Classic" specialty plate, pay a much higher rate of sales tax than an automobile meeting those criteria. A.B.A.T.E. of Minnesota feels this is wrong and has introduced legislation to have motorcycles on an even scale with automobiles. Motorcycles cause almost zero damage to our roads and should not be taxed at a higher rate than cars and trucks. Will you support this type of legislation?
- 4. A.B.A.T.E. of Minnesota believes in keeping our current insurance laws. Each year there are proposed bills that would require all Minnesota motorcyclists to carry uninsured and under insured insurance. This is opposed by a broad coalition of Minnesota motorcyclists. There are many insurance options in addition to the liability requirements that may be of benefit to a motorcycle rider, but these policy additions should be the motorcyclist's option. Most riders already have uninsured and under insured insurance but the extra cost of this insurance could make motorcycle riding too expensive for some, especially younger riders. Additionally, the passage of any legislation may have unintended consequences. Riders who face large increases in motorcycle insurance may choose to not purchase insurance at all. Are you in favor of keeping the current insurance laws in place?
- 5. A.B.A.T.E. of Minnesota opposes vehicle sales mandates. Some states, including Minnesota, are attempting to mandate a high percentage of new vehicles sold must be plug in electric or electric hybrid. Not knowing how these mandates would affect the sale of new motorcycles, this is a great concern to the motorcycling public. Motorcyclists oppose mandates that remove choice concerning make, model, style, fuel type, or other options of new vehicles considered for purchase. Are you in favor of stopping these mandates?
- 6. The current equal access statute (Minnesota Statue 604.12, Subd. 3) limits attorney fees to \$500 and caps punitive damages at \$500 in civil actions for violations of access to public accommodations. Removing these caps would ensure that individuals who are wrongfully denied access can afford adequate legal representation and receive fair compensation. This would also allow more equitable access to justice and ensure that punitive damages serve as a meaningful deterrent against violation. Do you support removing these caps?




