The following are address tips: Do not abbreviate County Road, Minnesota State Highway, Circle, do not use #sign (i.e. Co. Rd, ST, Hwy, CR, use Lot or Apt. or TRLR number, example: Trailer + number =TRLR 201 or Lot 201, or Apt 201).

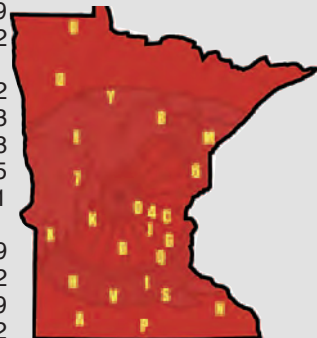

This includes the report I submitted with a photo for July Road Noise.

Unfortunately, my June report was reprinted in place of this but they included the photo I submitted for July, the explanation of the photo was not

published. I am trying again but before we get to my July/August report, I want to let people know we received 2025 W2R rockers but our participation this year has been better than the last several years so I have already run out, I was short 7 rockers. For the 7 that did not receive their 2025 rocker in July we have more ordered and will get them to you. I definitely need to make some improvements in this process, sorry. I would also like to point out at the time of my July report we did not know the status of lane splitting/filtering but we now know it became law July 1.

The 2025 Regular session of the Minnesota legislature has ended and a special session began June 9th. The most relevant issue at stake specific to motorcyclists is lane splitting/filtering. As I am writing this we don't know if lane splitting /filtering will take effect as planned or if changes will be made. We will notify people as soon as we know what happens. Unless it is changed during special session lane splitting /filtering will take effect July 1, 2025. A portion of the current language from statute 169.974 is stated here.

(g) A person may operate a motorcycle and overtake and pass another vehicle in the same direction of travel and within the same traffic lane if the motorcycle is operated:

(1) at not more than 25 miles per hour; and

(2) no more than 15 miles per hour over the speed of traffic in the relevant traffic lanes.

If the law does take effect as expected and lane splitting/filtering becomes legal please do so safely, within the limits of the law, and with respect for other drivers. If you do not have the appropriate skills to do it safely, please refrain from taking part, we do not want motorcyclists involved in crashes.

If you have not seen the Legislative Team update here are a few things to be aware of. Bills that will be around to help or haunt us in 2026.

- SF54, HF964 Reduction of sales tax for older motorcycles. We support
- SF2639, HF2494 Uninsured and underinsured mandate for motorcyclists. We oppose.
- SF2484, HF2519 Digital Fair Repair Act, addition of motorcycles. We support
- SF2891, HF2956 Remove cap on reasonable attorney fees for motorcyclist equal access violations. We support
- SF1505, HF686 Development of a model policy for safe traffic stops. We support (If motorcyclist anti-profiling language is added).

Special session should be over by the time you are reading this; legislators will be back home in their districts. Contact them over the summer, ask them to support our position on these issues.

Last month I mentioned my plans to attend Bikers in the Beltway and the possibility of a White House visit. We did make the trip and were able to take part in two White House tours, one took place Wednesday morning and was very interesting. The other a more private tour took place at 10:00 PM (yes PM) Tuesday. We expected our tour on Tuesday would include a visit to the oval office but when the time came, the president was still in the office working so understandable we did not get to take in that part of the tour. The White House is truly amazing and I am grateful that I had the opportunity to visit. (See photo above.)

The last item to mention is we still have not received the replacements for the 2025 W2R rockers, Kari is following up on these and I am hopeful that before you read this I will have them. I apologize again for not having taken better care of this.

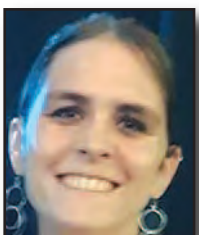

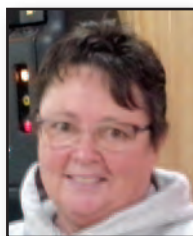
April and I have been working on things together. So, make sure you check out her Road Noise article

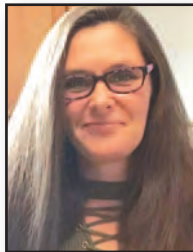

We will be making some substantial changes to A.B.A.T.E. of MN's 2026 Bikerday at the Capitol. Bikerday is scheduled for Wednesday, March 25, 2026, in the Capitol Rotunda starting at 1:00 PM. This is a change that will work in 2026 because it is the second year of the two-year legislative schedule. Bills affecting us have already been introduced. Our members have had an opportunity to communicate with those representing them to seek support. Bikerday 2026 will be an opportunity to show up as unified motorcyclists to reinforce support of motorcycling rights and common-sense motorcycling safety.

Here are some reasons we are making this change:

We need to make significant improvements to Bikerday attendance. This change will reduce the chances of below zero temperatures for the day. It will give people that have conflicts earlier in the year the opportunity to join us. The later date and time may allow some to arrive on their favorite ride. (We will work on group motorcycle parking near the Capitol if possible). We can

schedule bus arrivals at noon and departure by 5:00pm as a benefit for those traveling a long distance. This change may make it possible for some that have never joined us to attend.

We should be staying in contact with our legislators all year, but Bikerday 2026 will be a chance to let legislators know bikers care about our issues by showing up. To be successful in the future we need to have a greater presence at Bikerday. Can we bring the number of attendees up to four hundred? This attendance should be attainable based on the number of concerned riders in Minnesota.

Legislators pay attention to how many people show up to support issues. With a large number of motorcyclists at Bikerday 2026, we will keep Minnesota a great place to ride free in the future. Please do all you can to be there. Do it for yourself. Stand up for what you believe in.

The next meeting is a week after I submitted this report, so it should be relatively short. It is me writing it, so after all, who knows? As you may have seen or heard, the DPS rolled out the majority of the lane splitting public service awareness campaign the same day the law went into effect. While there was good news coverage, it is of my opinion (also shared by other members of the task force) that it should of been launched sooner. Regardless of my opinion or the opinion of the task force members, it simply isn't our decision. We only participate in an advisory capacity. Personally, I have not yet taken advantage of this new

freedom of choice, but that doesn't mean that I won't.

According to the last fatality report I received, there have been 13 motorcyclists (including one passenger) that have lost their lives this year compared to 22 at the same time last year. A positive direction, but the riding season is far from over. Unendorsed and unpermitted rider fatalities are around 46%. Riders not wearing a helmet are at a 61% fatality rate, while single vehicle crashes are at 54%. Please stay vigilant, make your own choice, and keep your head on a swivel.

Here is a bit of good news.

The recently passed H.R. 1 legislation signed includes a provision that will directly benefit those who purchase new motorcycles made or assembled in the United States. Interest paid on loans for qualifying new motorcycle purchases will now be tax-deductible.

Here are some important points to note. The deduction has a cap of \$10,000 and the benefit phases out based on increasing income levels. The change creates an "above-the-line" deduction for vehicle loan interest, meaning it reduces your adjusted gross income before calculating your taxable income. The position of the deduction is important because it will be available to most taxpayers, even those who do not itemize deductions. The bill states that vehicles impacted must be "manufactured primarily for use on public streets, roads, and highways" and are "a car, minivan, van, sport utility vehicle, pickup truck, or motorcycle." This policy is temporary, with an expiration in 2028. If you are in the market for a new bike over the next three years, be sure to do some research to see if this new policy will benefit you.

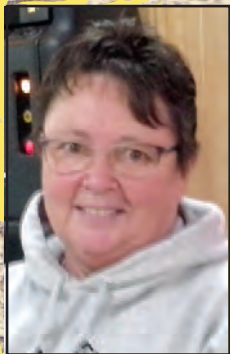

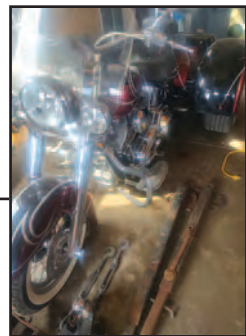

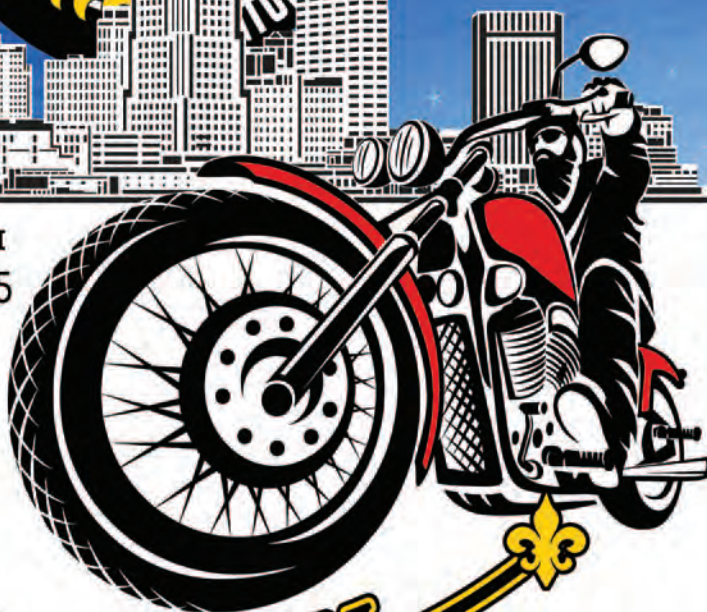
